It was a couple of days after posting the nominations that the tide started to emerge, and a clear winner surfaced: "Hell on Wheels." It built more and more votes over time, and eventually won with a pretty commanding 51% of the vote.

We will attest the victory to aggressive campaigning, and also having a tremendous fourth season that included wonderful performances, beautiful sets, and several emotional moments that probably had you welling up. (The end of Elam still gets us.)

It was a fairly-close race for second place, but "Longmire" ultimately won out with 21% compared to 15% for "Hannibal." The final two nominees in "Outlander" and "Silicon Valley" were both pretty far behind.
