

Van Helsing renewed for a second season

Vanessa Van Helsing will live on to battle more vampires.

American network Syfy announced Friday that her postapocalyptic adventures will continue after confirming a second season for the horror-thriller-scifi series Van Helsing.

The series, which shoots in Vancouver but was developed by Calgary-based Nomadic Pictures, stars Kelly Overton as a descendent of Dracula's famous vampire-slaying foe. After a volcano eruption spells doom for most earthlings, a nation of previously hidden vampires rise up.

Christopher Heyerdahl, Jonathan Scarfe and David Cubitt costar. Director and playwright Neil LaBute is the series' showrunner. "We have a terrifying road ahead planned for Vanessa and her allies and her enemies," LaBute said in a press release. "I think this is a world and a story that can be sustained for many years.

For now Van Helsing cannot be seen in Canada, although Nomadic Pictures co-chair Chad Oakes said he expects the series to start airing in English Canada within the next six months and on iTunes and Netflix Canada a year after that. The Calgary International Film Festival held a screening of two episodes of the show last month.

Nomadic Pictures also co-produces FX's Fargo and co-produced AMC's Hell on Wheels.
